# Updates & Next Steps

In April 2025, our community approved a  
**\$30 million capital referendum**  
to address facility needs throughout the Whitewater Unified School District.  
THIS WILL INCLUDE:



**\$19.4 million for**  
WHS updates, including  
new and expanded Career  
and Technical Education  
(CTE) space, cafeteria and  
kitchen updates, auditorium  
equipment, and tennis court  
replacement.



**\$7.9 million for**  
HVAC, electrical, and  
plumbing upgrades, new  
doors and windows, and  
parking lot improvements.



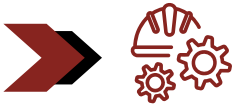
**\$2.4 million for**  
new drop-off and pick-up  
areas at WMS, new  
security camera systems,  
and ADA requirements.

Planning meetings with representatives from WUSD, Building Solutions, and Bray Architects have been ongoing. Our April and May sessions included reviews of the project's scope and discussions about the decision-making process.

WUSD received proposals for Construction Management services and awarded a contract to **JP Cullen**. Weekly meetings will take place with JP Cullen staff through the completion of the project.



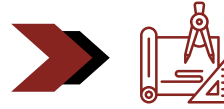




## Summer 2025 Work

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- Building controls at Lincoln Elementary
- Cameras at the elementary and middle schools



## Project Design & Bidding

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- Design process will continue through December 2025
- Project bidding expected in January 2026
- Construction begins February 2026 and concludes August 2027



## Construction Projects

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- **Capital Maintenance:** Summer 2025, Summer 2026, Summer 2027
- **WHS Addition & Renovation:** February-December 2026
- **WMS Site:** May-August 2026



## Seeing What's Possible

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Representatives from the school district have also taken time to tour schools throughout southeast Wisconsin to view potential examples of CTE spaces, Family and Consumer Science classrooms, kitchens, and cafeterias.

The tours included Muskego-Norway High School, Gateway Horizon Center, Gateway Kenosha Campus, Union Grove High School, Jefferson High School, Delavan-Darien High School, Badger High School, and Westosha Central High School.

## SURVEY WORK UNDERWAY

Survey fieldwork began at the high school and middle school campuses to document existing site conditions and the location of existing utilities. Geotechnical and soil boring proposals were sent for sampling to assist with structural design of the proposed additions at WHS.
